



NEW REPORT UNDERSCORES UNIQUE ROLE OF LONG-TERM CARE PHARMACIES IN ASSURING PATIENT SAFETY, IMPROVING HEALTH OUTCOMES, AND LOWERING HEALTHCARE COSTS

Long-term care (LTC) pharmacies are a critical component of our healthcare system, supporting hundreds of thousands of individuals with some of the most complex care needs nationwide.

LTC pharmacies provide careful, long-term medication management as well as patient and caregiver education to reduce the barriers that typically hinder use of prescription medications.

"Long-term care pharmacies play an essential role in communities across the U.S., particularly as more of our population ages. This report underscores the important opportunity for Congress to remove barriers and allow LTC pharmacies to improve outcomes and reduce the cost of care for seniors and individuals with disabilities, not just in institutional care but in home- and community-based settings, as well."
